Along with over 100 partners, we continue to research new ways to manage HIV. We are working relentlessly every day to find a cure for HIV through one of the largest research programs in the world.

For every one of us living with HIV, for every one of us who is at risk, for all of us, we will not rest until HIV and its impact are put in the past.

# CHANGING THE CONVERSATION AROUND HIV

While four decades have passed since the start of the HIV epidemic, the stigma surrounding it continues to exist. Disparities, misperceptions and misinformation continue to get in the way of people knowing their status and engaging in care.

It's only through our collective voices and efforts that we can change the conversation.

As part of the community, we're putting educational programs in place to help clear up misconceptions, address stigma and make sure everyone has the information and tools they need to get the care they deserve.

### KNOWING YOUR STATUS

Testing is the only way to know if you have HIV, and getting tested isn't much different from getting a wellness exam. If everyone knew their status, we could protect ourselves and each other, bringing us closer to ending the epidemic.

#### But it all starts with each of us being willing to get tested.

Through programs such as Stop the Virus and Healthysexual®, we are encouraging everyone to make testing a part of routine sexual health and to talk to their healthcare providers.

Together with the community, Gilead is committed to helping ensure that people living with or at risk for HIV know the facts and get the support they need.

## MAKING PREVENTION A PRIORITY

No matter what our status, there are ways that we can help protect each other from HIV. Through innovative therapies, we are helping to prevent HIV from being acquired. Today, there are treatments that can help keep HIV from progressing and being transmitted.

HIV prevention methods and practices include PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) and Treatment as Prevention (TasP), practicing safer sex and talking to partners and your healthcare provider, as well as getting tested regularly for HIV and other STIs. These practices can play a critical role, not only for those at risk, but in putting an end to the HIV epidemic.

But it's more than just innovative therapies and HIV treatments. Together with the community, we are putting programs in place that help prevent disparities and lack of access from impeding care, and are encouraging everyone to know their status as a routine part of sexual health.

Making prevention a priority can help get us closer to the day when we end the epidemic.



### ACCESS TO THERAPY

It can sometimes feel overwhelming when it comes to understanding health insurance and affording HIV medicine. Making sure that those who need care, regardless of where they live or what resources they have, is in all of our interests.

The Gilead Advancing Access® program is committed to helping eligible individuals in the US afford their Gilead HIV medications. Whether someone is insured or not, Advancing Access® can help eligible individuals find financial and insurance support information.

In addition, through community partners, we are providing access to medicines in over 130 countries.

We are helping provide access to HIV medicines for eligible individuals in need.

# STANDING SIDE BY SIDE WITH THE COMMUNITY


It will take all of us to achieve our common goal of ending the HIV epidemic.


